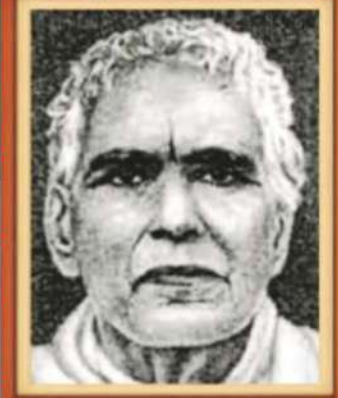

Company Formation Program

The Company Formation Program is a distinct feature of the college. Under this program practical exposure is given to the students right from the formation to the winding up of the company. So far, five companies *Craft Crunch, Tangled Threads, Celebrino, Stamades & Old Bricks* have been formed and have generated fruitful dividends.

Online Trading in Stock Market

The college provides training for *Online Trading*. The students are made to learn stock market working and are also taught how to create and manage their own portfolios, apply concepts like bid, future, option & much more. The students get an opportunity to earn profit.

UGC-NET Coaching

The college imparts *UGC-NET* coaching to M.Com. students without charging any fee. This test is conducted to determine the eligibility of Assistant Professors and for the award of Junior Research Fellowships in Indian Universities and Colleges.

Entrepreneurship and Business Cell

The college has set up *Entrepreneurship and Business Cell* to build an institutional mechanism for providing guidance in entrepreneurship. The idea is to teach the students various issues like cost, market research, the ways to raise finance to start a new venture or to buy an already existing business.

Placement Cell

The Training & Placement Cell provides placement assistance for employment of the students. The Cell liaisons with corporate organizations like Amazon, Nextcare, Eclerx, Senso, Unico, MNCs at IT Park Chandigarh and leading banks like HDFC for this purpose. So far, a number of leading companies including Concentrix, Daksh Services Pvt. Ltd. have visited the college and recruited our students for various job posts. The cell provides opportunity to students to work with leading corporate houses like Amazon, Next care, Dhara services under stipend based Internship during their course.

Case Study Approach

The college promotes case studies - a research method involving in-depth examination of a subject of study and its related contextual conditions. So far, the college has taken up 5 major case studies on the movie *Dangal*, a famous company *NOKIA, NIRMA, Cochin International Airport, Mawlynnong Village* and a case study on *Unpacking APPLE: A successful Saga.* "Think out of box. Think Different. Two mini case studies on Management Lessons from Ramyana and Journey of Pyare Khan were also discussed.

Self Defence for Girls

To equip the girl students with the requisite skills of *self defence*, the college conducts workshops for them in which they are trained under the able guidance of experts and are skilled in techniques of self defence. So far, three workshops have been successfully completed where in around hundred & thirty girls have been trained.

SKILL DEVELOPMENT COURSES

Skill Development Courses in collaboration with MSME on Mobile App Development, Digital Marketing, Mobile Repair, Fashion Designing and Retail Banking in association with iTinker, NSIC, and Mansha Training and Development Centre.

NPTEL COURSES

The National Program on Technology Enhanced Learning (NPTEL) is a project funded by the MHRD. Certified Courses on Consumer Behavior, Principles of Human Resource Management, Global Marketing Management, Business analytics for Management decisions, Managing Services, E-Business, Developing Soft Skills and Personality are a few to name.

SPOKEN TUTORIALS

The college is a “Resource Centre” of IIT Mumbai (a project launched by the MHRD). It offers FOSS (Free-Open Source Software) courses. A variety of “Spoken Tutorials” are available under this project. So far, 421 students have completed these courses and added value to their degree.

NATIONAL STOCK EXCHANGE COURSES

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- Admission will be made as per the rules/instructions/admission schedule of Punjabi University, Patiala.
- Each candidate will fill up the offline admission form in his/her own handwriting & submit the form complete in all respects in the office of the college.
- The candidates can also apply online at www.ggdsdkherigurna.ac.in
- The candidates will be admitted to the desired course on the basis of the merit list prepared by the college.
- The merit list shall be displayed on the Notice Board/Website of the college.
- The selected candidates along with their parents/guardians will be required to report for counselling/verification of the documents on the date and time displayed on the Notice Board/Website of the college.

IMPORTANT GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION

- The candidates are strictly advised to check the Admission Schedule and Eligibility Criteria for the desired course before filling up the admission form.
- A candidate who has appeared in the qualifying examination and his/her result is still awaited should submit the application form as per the admission schedule. However, he/she will be required to submit the result at the time of counselling.
- On the day of counselling, the candidates are advised to bring self-attested photocopies of all the original certificates, as mentioned in the box below.
- A candidate who has passed the previous examination from any Board other than Punjab School Education Board, Mohali/ Board of School Education, Haryana/ Himachal Pradesh Board of School Education/ CBSE/ ICSE Board, will have to obtain eligibility certificate from Punjabi University, Patiala.
- A candidate who has been placed under compartment/ reappear in 10+2 examination will not be allowed to seek admission in any degree course in the college. If the candidate passes the compartment/ reappear examination, he/she may be granted admission as per the admission schedule and the conditions laid down for this purpose by the Punjabi University, Patiala.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED

All the candidates will have to produce the original documents/testimonials at the time of admission. They must submit/attach self-attested photocopies of each of the required document along with the application form.

- 10+2 Examination Detailed Marks Card (DMC)
- Matriculation Certificate showing Date of Birth
- Character Certificate from the institution last attended
- If there is a gap in studies, an Affidavit about the activity undertaken during this period
- Migration Certificate from the previous Board/University other than Punjab School Education Board or Punjabi University, Patiala.
- A candidate who opts for Punjabi Elementary/Mudla Gyan will have to submit an Affidavit at the time of admission that :
 - he/she is not a resident of Punjab or,
 - he/she has not studied Punjabi at matric or +2 Level.

ADDITIONAL SEATS

- As per the rules of Punjabi University, Patiala. For details, kindly refer to Punjabi University Website www.punjabiuniversity.ac.in

ADMISSION PROCESS FOR OLD STUDENTS

- Normal admission will be granted within 15 working days of declaration of University results or before the last date of admission, whichever is earlier or with late fee as per the rules of the Punjabi University, Patiala.
- The candidates are required to purchase a copy of the college prospectus or download the same through www.ggdsdkherigurna.ac.in
- The candidates are required to fill up the application form and attach a self attested copy of the result of the previous class.
- The candidates will also be required to show the original certificates to the admission committee, at the time of admission.

RE-ADMISSION RULES

- If a student after depositing the admission fee, remains absent for a stretch of ten days in the beginning of the session, his/her name would be struck off from the rolls of the college. The name(s) of such candidate(s) will be displayed on the Notice Board/Website of the college. The Principal may re-admit such candidate on receipt of request from the student, within one week from the date when his/her name was struck off from the rolls, justifying his/her absence from the class. But, in no case, the re-admission will be allowed after two weeks.
- If a student remains absent continuously for ten days during the course of study, his/her name would be struck off from the rolls. The name(s) of such candidate(s) will be displayed on the Notice Board/Website of the college. In case such a student does not seek re-admission from the Principal, within one week from the date of his/her name being struck off from the rolls, he/she will not be allowed re-admission.
- The name of the candidate will be struck off from the college rolls, if he/she fails to deposit the fee and all other dues within the stipulated time as determined by the college from time to time. The re-admission will be allowed within seven days with the permission of the Principal. The candidate will also have to pay the re-admission fee and the fine.
- If the name of a student is struck off for the third time, for whatsoever reason during one semester, his/her admission will be cancelled.

RESERVATION POLICY

The college will follow the Reservation Policy as per the rules of Punjab Govt./Punjabi University, Patiala.

LEAVE RULES

- Leave up to maximum 8 days per semester will be granted on the condition of prior intimation.
- Leave only up to 3 days will be sanctioned by the respective Class In-Charge, and beyond that will be sanctioned by the Principal.
- Only those leave application forms will be considered that are duly signed by the Father/ Mother/legal Guardian of the concerned student.
- Leave up to maximum 10 days per semester will be granted on medical grounds, certified by an MBBS Doctor or a Doctor of a Government Hospital. The leave application must be submitted in the college office either during the leave period or immediately after the leave has been availed of.

CONDONING OF LECTURES

- If the required percentage of attendance is deficient on account of the participation of the student in Sports/NCC/NSS/Extra Curricular Activities, Educational Excursions, etc. approved by the Principal, credit may be given by the Principal for the number of day(s) for which prior sanction was obtained. This condoning would be over and above the limits provided in the existing rules and regulations.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR UNIVERSITY EXAMINATIONS

- The Examination form of the student will be sent to the University only on the basis of the eligibility fixed by the Punjabi University, Patiala. The students are expected to consult the official website of the Punjabi University, Patiala (www.punjabiversity.ac.in) for any amendment(s) in these rules from time to time.

ATTENDANCE AND OTHER REQUIREMENTS

- According to the University rules to be eligible to appear in the University examinations, every student will have to satisfy the following requirements:

M.Com. & PGDEBM

- a) Every candidate will be required to attend a minimum of 75% lectures delivered to that class in each paper as well as 75% of the laboratory work, seminars etc. separately.

B.Com. (Honours)/B.Com./B.B.A.

- a) Every candidate will be required to attend a minimum of 75% lectures delivered to that class in each paper as well as 75% of the laboratory work, seminars etc. separately.
- b) Every candidate must have obtained in the MST at least 25% marks in each paper; 33% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects of the semester.

B.A. & DCA

- a) Every candidate will be required to attend a minimum of 75% lectures delivered to that class in each paper as well as 75% of the laboratory work, seminars etc. separately.
- b) Every candidate must have obtained in the MST at least 25% marks in each paper; 25% marks in the aggregate of all the subjects of the semester.

* Eligibility rules, attendance and other requirements are subject to change as notified by the Punjabi University, Patiala from time to time.

* The Principal at his discretion may allow a special test to a candidate who could not appear in the house examination owing to unavoidable reasons or fails to secure the minimum marks as prescribed above.

HOUSE EXAMINATION RULES

House Examinations are conducted twice in a semester, in order to determine the eligibility of the students to sit in the final university examinations. The following points are kept in mind while preparing the award list:-

- A student who fails to appear in any paper in these examinations will be awarded zero in that paper, whatsoever be the reason of absence.
- A fine of Rs. 100/- per paper will be imposed on any student who remains absent in these examinations without prior permission.
- Any student who fails to fulfill the eligibility criterion in these examinations may be required to reappear in the Special Test on the scheduled dates as decided by the Principal, provided the Principal permits him/her to sit for the same.
- A student found guilty of using unfair means in these examinations will be fined according to the gravity of the offence and will also be liable to detention or expulsion. It will also automatically render the student ineligible for the award of any prize, concession, scholarship or stipend for that session.

UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION FORM

- The University examination form must be filled up as notified by Punjabi University, Patiala
- A student is required to fill up the examination form very carefully.
- For any mistake, the student will himself/herself be responsible & he/she shall be liable to pay the rectification fee/fine imposed by the University.

Boys Hostel

The college has ultra modern, trendy, stylish and luxurious Boys Hostel. The rooms have attached washrooms, all other modern amenities and are elegantly furnished. The hostel has a well equipped Mess, a spacious Dining Hall, a Recreation Room, a Reading Room, a Sports Room having excellent arrangement for indoor games. The Hostel has limited seats on first come first served basis.

The hostel charges include Board and Lodging facilities, Breakfast, Lunch, Evening Tea and Dinner. The hallmark of the hostel facility is a home like atmosphere where nutritious food prepared in extraordinary hygienic conditions is served.

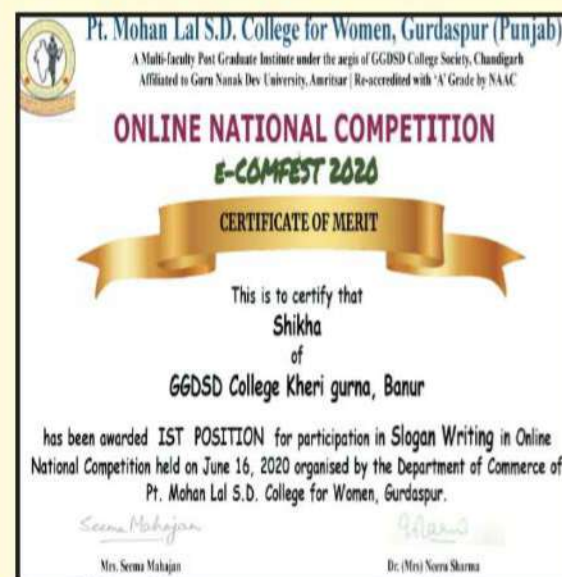
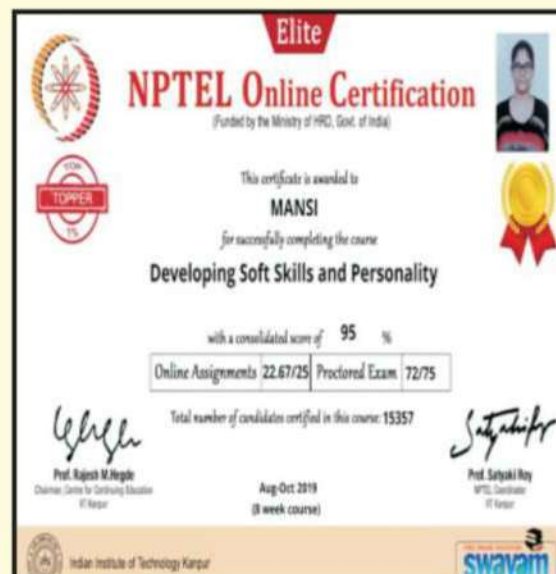

Anti Ragging Rules: Ragging Is Totally Banned



RAGGING MEANS THE FOLLOWING :

Any conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities which cause or are likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof, in a fresher or a junior student, or asking the student to do any act or perform something which such student will not perform in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment, so as to adversely affect the psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

PUNISHMENT FOR RAGGING

- Abetment to ragging
- Criminal conspiracy to rag
- Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging
- Public nuisance created during ragging
- Violation of decency and morals through ragging
- Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt
- Wrongful restraint
- Wrongful confinement
- Use of criminal force
- Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences
- Extortion
- Criminal trespass
- Offences against property
- Criminal intimidation
- Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s)
- Physical or psychological humiliation
- All other offences following from the definition of 'Ragging'



Punishments at the Institution Level

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges
- Withholding / withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process
- Withholding results
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel
- Cancellation of Admission
- Rustication from the institution for a period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period
- Fine ranging between Rs. 25,000 and Rs. 1 lakh
- Collective punishment : When the person (s) committing or abetting the crime of ragging is / are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

College Code of Conduct

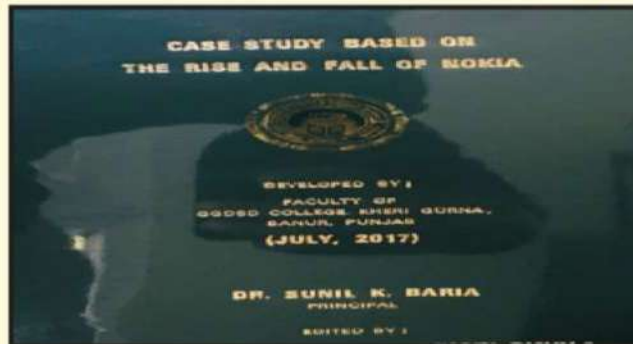
